## WEEK 3 PREVIEW

Two PFL contests highlight Week 3 action across the league. Five other non-conference tilts round out the league's schedule with four contests against fellow FCS opposition.

**Marist** will play its second conference contest in as many weeks when it heads cross country to face **San Diego**. The Red Foxes have not defeated the Toreros in four previous meetings all of which have taken place in San Diego, including a 40-22 USD victory last season. Both squads suffered losses in Week 2 – Marist dropping a home PFL affair to Drake while San Diego fell on the road to Northern Colorado.

A "Tar Heel State" tussle will see **Campbell** and **Davidson** – teams separated by 160 miles – each open their PFL campaigns. The Wildcats won last season's meeting, 49-0, which was one of the Camels four shutout losses – all in PFL play – during their freshman campaign. Davidson will seek its first scoring drive this season after suffering back-to-back shutouts this season. Campbell has rolled up 76 points in its first two contests, but fell in overtime at Birmingham-Southern last weekend.

**Dayton** will make its first road trip this season when it meets Joe Walton-coached Robert Morris at Joe Walton Stadium. Both squads are seeking their first victories this season. The Flyers lost their season-opener in Week 2 by three points. The Colonials are 0-2 but lost their opener by one point before falling by three points in Week 2.

**Butler** continues its Hoosier State tour when it hosts to Hanover the 23rd meeting between two foes. The two teams were scheduled to play last season but severe storm damage on the Hanover campus caused that game to be cancelled. Butler has won its first two outings this season behind the impressive play of sophomore quarterback Andrew Huck who has earned the league's first two "Offensive Player of the Week" honors.

**Jacksonville** will play its first home contest in Week 3 and hosts Old Dominion. The Dolphins went 1-1 in their first two road games, but lost at Samford last weekend. The Monarchs are returning to football for the first time in 69 years but have won their first two contests.

**Morehead State** heads across the Appalachian Mountains to meet North Carolina Central, an independent program moving into the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference next season. MSU was shutout last weekend at St. Francis to even its record at 1-1. NCCU has opened its campaign with back-to-back road losses, Saturday's game serving as its home opener.

**Drake** and South Dakota will meet for the first time since 1972 when they meet in Vermillion, S.D., Saturday. The Bulldogs have opened their 2009 campaign with back-to-back victories, including a crucial PFL win at Marist in Week 2. South Dakota, in the midst of reclassifying to Division I, dropped its Week 2 contest at Northern Iowa to level its record at 1-1.

### Andrew Huck, Butler

Sophomore, Quarterback, Bloomington, Ind.

Huck completed 33-of-48 passes for 316 yards and four touchdowns to lead Butler in a 49-19 victory at Franklin, Saturday. He also carried the ball nine times for 35 yards and a touchdown – a five-yard dash four seconds into the fourth quarter that ended his day. It was the second straight week he threw for more than 300 yards, tossed four or more touchdowns and also rushed for a score. His 33 completions are the fourth most in FCS this young season and his 48 attempts are the seven most in the subdivision this year. Huck has 643 passing yards in the season's first two weeks.

Chipperfield was called on to punt 11 times in Jacksonville's 27-0 loss at Samford and delivered each time, amassing 468 punting yards. Both his punt total and yardage count are the most in the FCS this season. The Dolphins had 15 possessions in the contest, Chipperfield ending the possession 11 times. In addition Samford was unable to do anything with his punts, returning three punts for two total yards and fair catching four others. Jacksonville's special teams downed three punts and another floated into the end zone for a touchback. Chipperfield had two punts over 50 yards and had two downed inside the 20-yard line.

**2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS**

**CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY:** A long wait came to and end, Saturday, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at the home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

**WELCOME MARIST:** For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

**BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION:** Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

**VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:** Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

**SAN DIEGO'S TRUJILLO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST:** For the fourth straight year the USD football program will be represented on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, bestowed annually upon the top player in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Senior quarterback Sebastian Trujillo (Durango, CO) is on the initial list of 20 candidates heading into the 2009 campaign. He follows in the footsteps of quarterback Josh Johnson (2006 & 2007) and wide receiver John Matthews (2008). In final voting, Johnson was 6th in 2006 and 3rd in 2007; Matthews placed 7th last season.

**DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY:** Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

**DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG:** Dayton opened its 2009 campaign with a loss to Urbana in Week 2 but posted 10 points to extend the nation's longest streak of avoiding a shutout. The Flyers have not been shutout in 366 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. *A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.*

**SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL:** For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:

**DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE:** Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
