WEEK 6 PREVIEW

Week Six has four Pioneer Football League contests slated, but both of the league's 2-0 squads – Drake (non-conference game) and Butler (off week) – will take a breather from PFL action. The league's other two unbeaten squads – Dayton and Jacksonville – will hit the road seeking to maintain that status. The league's remaining two contests pit teams that each lost in Week 5 and will seek redemption this week.

Former PFL South Division members will square off when Morehead State travels across the Appalachian Mountains to meet Davidson. Both teams dropped contests last week, Davidson losing at Jacksonville while Morehead State fell at home to Dayton. The Eagles are still seeking their season's first PFL victory while the Wildcats will attempt to end MSU's two-game win streak in the series.

Jacksonville takes its seven-game PFL win streak into New York for its first-ever meeting with Marist. The Dolphins, who downed Davidson at home last week, return to New York where it met Albany in the 2008 Gridiron Classic. The Red Foxes earned their first PFL victory against Campbell, snapping a three-game overall losing streak.

Dayton also heads across the Appalachians when it meets Campbell in its first visit to Barker-Lane Stadium. Dayton was the lone road team to win last week, earning a victory at Morehead State. Campbell fell on the road but returns home for the first time since a season-opening home victory against Methodist.

Drake steps out of conference action this week when it hosts Missouri S&T at Drake Stadium. The Bulldogs are unbeaten at home this season, including a victory against Valparaiso in PFL action last week.

San Diego makes a second consecutive trip to Indiana when it meets Valparaiso. The Toreros did not fare well in their last visit to the Hoosier State, dropping a 25-24 decision at Butler courtesy a last-second field goal. Valparaiso will play its second home game this season and is still seeking its first home victory.

2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

YOUTH MOVEMENT AT SIGNAL CALLER: A youth movement is afoot among the PFL's quarterback corps. Four teams – Butler, Drake, Jacksonville and Valparaiso – have regularly used a sophomore signal caller this season while Marist has seen its sophomore quarterback split time with a senior. Three sophomores – Butler's Andrew Huck, Jacksonville's Josh McGregor and Drake's Mike Pitkowski – are ranked 1-2-3 among the league's passing yardage leaders. In addition, San Diego has turned to redshirt freshman Sam Scudellari to take the snaps the rest of this season after senior Sebastian Trujillo left the team due to personal reasons.

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOHNSON MAKES FIRST NFL START: Johnson was tapped as Tampa Bay's starting quarterback prior to its Week 4 contest at Washington. In his first start, Johnson completed 13-of-22 passes for 106 yards and was the team's second-leading rusher with 41 yards on 17 carries. His first throw of the game went for an eight-yard touchdown just two minutes into the game, giving Tampa Bay an early lead it would relinquish in the third quarter of a 16-13 loss. A fifth-round draft pick in 2008, Johnson made the 53-man roster as a rookie but was inactive for every game. At San Diego, he put up enormous numbers, including an NCAA FCS career record passing efficiency of 176.68. Johnson also ran for 1,864 yards and 19 touchdowns for the Toreros. As a senior, Johnson posted an incredible 43-1 touchdown-interception ratio while also rushing for 726 yards.

CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY: A long wait came to an end, Sept. 5, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at the home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

WELCOME MARIST: For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION: Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First

Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY: Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

MORE ABOUT VICTORIES: Last season, Dayton became the 11th NCAA FCS team – and the first west of the Alleghenies – to win at least 600 games in its football history when it downed Davidson. Here are the 12 members of the club, heading into the 2009 season. Yale (853), Harvard (798), Penn (796), Princeton (780), Fordham (738), Dartmouth (643), Lafayette (640), Delaware (633), Lehigh (625), Cornell (616), Dayton (603) and North Dakota State (601).

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Including Saturday's victory at Morehead State, the Flyers have not been shutout in 370 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. *A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.*

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL: For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:
