WEEK 9 PREVIEW

Will it be trick or treat for the PFL's three unbeaten teams in Week 8? Butler, Dayton and Drake – each 4-0 in PFL action – all return home after road victories in Week 7. Marist returns home looking for its fourth straight victory while Campbell and Morehead State each seek their season's first PFL victory.

Butler is now just one of three unbeaten teams in the FCS – along Montana and Richmond – and hosts Davidson, a team that has not won a road game this season. The Bulldogs are 7-0 for the first time since 1983 after holding on for a victory at Campbell last week. The Wildcats have lost two straight games after surrendering a 21-16 loss to PFL co-leader Drake. It will be the second straight week Davidson has met one of the league's three unbeaten squads.

Marist has won three straight contests and seeks its first four-game win streak since 1997 when it hosts Valparaiso which is seeking its first PFL victory this season. The Red Foxes won their first road PFL game last week at Morehead State, coming back from a 14-point deficit. The Crusaders were held to a season-low 60 yards in its loss at Dayton last week and will seek to bounce back on the road, where they have posted their only victory this season.

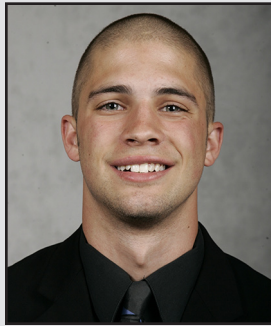
Morehead State travels to Campbell as both teams seek their first PFL victories this season. The Eagles hit the road after surrendering a 14-point lead in a loss to Marist last week. It will be Morehead State's ninth-straight contest and will be the last PFL team to take an off week when they get a break in Week 10. The Camels have seen their margin of defeat dwindle in each of its last four losses, shrinking to just seven points in a loss to co-leader Butler last week.

Dayton will treat area children with its annual Toys for Tots drive while seeking to avoid a trick from visiting San Diego. The Flyers have rebounded from a season-opening loss with six straight victories – all after senior Steve Valentino made the transition from wide receiver to quarterback – including a 38-7 victory at Valparaiso that showcased the Flyers defense (60 yards allowed). San Diego fell to Jacksonville, 34-16, last week – its second-straight home loss and now returns to the road where its 2-2 this season.

Jacksonville, the league's only one-loss team, will try to bring one of the leagues unbeaten to its level when it travels to Drake. The Dolphins made their longest possible PFL road trip in Week 8, winning at San Diego. Jacksonville follows that with its second-longest possible trip this week. Drake returns home – where it has not lost this season (3-0) – after posting a come-from-behind victory at Davidson last week.

Valentino won his sixth consecutive start, rushing for three touchdowns and tossing another in Dayton's 38-7 PFL victory at Valparaiso, Saturday. On the ground, he carried the ball 17 times for career bests in yardage (127 yards) and touchdowns (three). Through the air, Valentino completed 13-of-18 passes for 188 yards and a touchdown. He finished the day with 315 total yards offense – all while playing just three quarters. His 13 passes went to seven different receivers.

Brandon Wingeier, Dayton

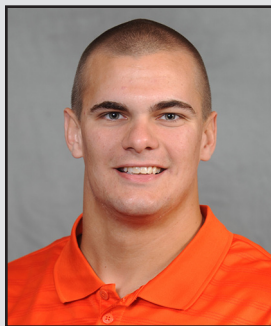
Senior, Defensive End, Newark, Ohio

Willets made three field goals to keep Campbell close in a 23-16 PFL loss to league co-leader Butler, Saturday. He made field goals of 38, 43 and 37 yards and tacked on an PAT to account for 10 of the Camels 16 points. Willets third-quarter 43-yard field goal was a career long and drew Campbell within a touchdown of the lead. He also posted career-highs for field goals made and points scored with the effort. 2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

BUTLER ONE OF THREE REMAINING UNBEATENS IN FCS: Butler enters Week 9 as one of three remaining unbeaten teams in the FCS. The Bulldogs are joined by Montana (7-0, Big Sky) and Richmond (6-0, Colonial) as the only teams left with an unblemished mark this season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT AT SIGNAL CALLER: A youth movement is afoot among the PFL's quarterback corps. Four teams – Butler, Drake, Jacksonville and Valparaiso – have regularly used a sophomore signal caller this season while Marist has seen its sophomore quarterback split time with a senior. Three sophomores – Butler's Andrew Huck, Jacksonville's Josh McGregor and Drake's Mike Pitkowski – are ranked 1-2-3 among the league's passing yardage leaders. No. 4 on the list is Dayton senior quarterback Steve Valentino who is starting at quarterback for the first time in his collegiate career. In addition, San Diego has turned to redshirt freshman Sam Scudellari (No. 5 on the list) to take the snaps the rest of this season after senior Sebastian Trujillo left the team due to personal reasons.

PFL ALUMNI IN THE NFL: Two PFL alumni are seeing regular playing time as professionals. San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson is the starting quarterback for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, getting the nod in Week 3 at Washington. Drake alumnus Billy Cundiff was picked up as a kicker by the Cleveland Browns and also made his first 2009 appearance during Week 3 at Baltimore. It is Johnson's second season in the NFL while Cundiff is in his sixth season.

CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY: A long wait came to an end, Sept. 5, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at their home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

WELCOME MARIST: For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION: Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participa-

tion in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY: Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

MORE ABOUT VICTORIES: Last season, Dayton became the 11th NCAA FCS team – and the first west of the Alleghenies – to win at least 600 games in its football history when it downed Davidson. Here are the 12 members of the club, heading into the 2009 season. Yale (853), Harvard (798), Penn (796), Princeton (780), Fordham (738), Dartmouth (643), Lafayette (640), Delaware (633), Lehigh (625), Cornell (616), Dayton (603) and North Dakota State (601).

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Including Saturday's victory at Valparaiso, the Flyers have not been shutout in 372 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. *A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.*

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL: For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:
